Old Business

Square One Art

Alison Storm is organizing and working with Laurie Sweet the art teacher. Students' artwork was shipped to Square One, catalogs should arrive on 10/19/15, and orders should be placed by 10/30/15. Final products should be delivered by 11/23/15 prior to the start of Thanksgiving recess which starts 11/25/15. Alison Storm viewed the artwork before it was sent out and was very impressed with the quality of the students' final pieces. Students started with a first draft then refined and remade it into his/her final original work of art. Some students were unable to finish his/her artwork in the time allotted so extra time was taken in class. Alison suggested that next year it may be beneficial to hold an after school session to finish artwork.

Scholastic Book Fair

Morris Senior Center

Jessy Barone spoke with Kristin Davila the Director/Municipal Agent at the Morris Senior Center. She expressed interest in a night of shopping during the tree lighting ceremony and having a table to sell craft items made by seniors. In the past, the PTO coordinated local vendors to sell their products here, but the PTO no longer coordinates this event. Kristin was referred to the Brian Leonard at the Morris Rec. Dept.

Kristin Davila/Morris Senior Center organize "Big Bus Trips" which are open to the public. The next trip is to the Radio City Music Hall Trip this December.

School Enrichments

Principal Chapman is continuing to work with students and staff on deciding on enrichments and field trips for this school year. During the September PTO meeting Principal Chapman discussed the possibility of afterschool classes, but it was decided that this particular vendor was too expensive to offer. Principal Chapman discussed upcoming "Enrichment Clusters," about which he will be sharing information in an upcoming E-Blast.

Arts Alive

Will Discuss possibly continuing Arts Alive but on a more affordable budget. Old notes showed that the budget was \$5000 in the past. Principal Chapman shared that when JMS staff were polled, 50 % were in favor of continuing with Arts Alive and 50% were not. Mrs. Maillet shared that Arts Alive was started by Deb Goepel as a way to bring local artisans into the school and reestablish a connection to the community.

PTO Membership

There is a lack of attendance at PTO meetings. Discussed was how to encourage greater attendance at PTO meetings and participation in PTO sponsored functions. Promoted was the idea of having membership list and specific PTO email list to send out PTO minutes. Also, suggested was the idea of framing membership around the goal of strengthening the connection to the community. Conveying this, demonstrates that there is a purpose and awareness to the PTO membership. Suggested, was doing a "meet and greet" potluck night where JMS parents can meet each other.
